ORDINANCE NO. 22-05 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FORNEY, TEXAS, ORDERING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON MAY 7, 2022, FOR THE PURPOSE OF VOTING ON THE ADOPTION OR REJECTION OF THE ADOPTION OF TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, CHAPTER 143, MUNICIPAL CIVIL SERVICE, FOR THE POLICE OFFICERS AND FIRE FIGHTERS OF THE CITY OF FORNEY; DESIGNATING THE PLACES AT WHICH SAID ELECTION IS TO BE HELD; APPOINTING THE EARLY VOTING CLERK; PROVIDING FOR POSTING AND PUBLICATION OF NOTICE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

167 The motion passed by a vote of 5 ayes, 1 nay [Powers] and 1 absent [Chambers].

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Discussion regarding proposed bond projects.

Mayor Lewis stated that after further conversation with City Management, our Fire Chief and first responders, it is apparent that some of the Public Safety elements of the bond need to be acted upon now. I will ask Chief Briggs to come up and elaborate but want to point out there is necessary action that needs to occur tonight.

As we know, the location of Fire Station #1 in relation to the train and the lack of space in Fire
Station #2 are major concerns. Just note - these are our only two stations responsible for providing
service for 80 square miles in and around Forney otherwise known as the Emergency Services
District (or "ESD").

Public Safety and Roads goes without saying as top priorities of the residents, and we as a Council is the responsible party to be the driving force to get them prioritized and completed - even ahead of the curve if necessary. The proposed bond had three public safety improvements:

185 1) a New Fire Station #1

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- 186 2) expansion of Fire Station #2 and
- 187 3) a new Fire Station #3
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The first problem the Forney Fire Department faces is the # of resources we currently have vs the # of service calls it responds to. Our fire department currently responds to each and every call regardless of severity. A discussion around how to best service 911 calls is still occurring and not finalized. In lieu of throwing more resources at a problem without a conversation around expanding Dispatch does both a disservice to our residents and its taxpayer dollars.

195 Staff has requested that there be a reevaluation of Fire Station #1 - including but not limited 196 to adding additional Dispatch. The Fire Station #1 design as presented does not have adequate 197 space, and I am not comfortable with the likelihood that the City would need to go back to the 198 taxpayers at a later date or issue debt to make additions to Fire Station #1 because it was 199 not designed and built for the proper growth. In the interim, while a redesign is evaluated, the 200 Fire Department would add a company, engine, and equipment on a separate location on the 201 southside of the tracks on an interim basis. When FireStation #1 is satisfactorily re-designed 202 and built, all these resources would then relocate to the newstation. Delaying this portion of the 203 bond is sufficient as long as we have the new resources started in the interim.

Second, the expansion of Fire Station #2 is satisfactory with management and should start immediately. Please note that a delay to the November ballot adds at least a year to its completion.

209 The public safety prioritization is our responsibility and should be done sooner rather than later. 210 It is in the best interest that there be a re-design of Fire Station #1, implementation of additional 211 resources at a separate temporary location, and immediately begin work on Fire Station #2. I am 212 going to ask Chief Briggs to come up to the podium at this time for discussion, but I am first going 213 to make a motion to revisit the design of Fire Station #1, add resources at a separate temporary 214 location for the interim, and immediately begin the work necessary to expand Fire Station #2. The 215 additional firefighters, equipment, and engine as the 'interim solution' is estimated at \$1.3M and 216 Fire Station #2 construction cost has been presented at \$6.7M for a total of \$8.0M. The funding 217 would be our current unencumbered funds.

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219 During discussion, Chief Briggs addressed the Council and spoke to the necessary action for the 220 expansion of Fire Station #2. He stated that he thinks this is one of the guickest on the bond to 221 give them the ability to hire and house more employees, which provides more resources to answer 222 calls. Second, Chief Briggs stated that the whole bond package is an amazing opportunity for 223 public safety, but the timing of the bond election creates a significant delay in any realized 224 improved service delivery because of the amount of time it takes to order a fire truck, hire people, 225 and build brick and mortar buildings. There is a need for creative interim solutions while the bond 226 package proceeds. Partnering with the District Board is an option to provide temporary housing 227 and make that a functional fire company location on the south side (near FM 741) sooner than 228 waiting on the bond to get the new Fire Station #1 built. Lastly, the call volume has increased 229 significantly for both fire and police. With the new projections from the school district, the dispatch 230 component is integral to long term success. Chief Briggs wants to look at different options for 231 allowing the growth of dispatch to help manage the increased calls for service, and therefore 232 would like to look at the design to make sure we aren't missing anything long term and make sure 233 the building will serve the needs for the City for the next 25 years.

After discussion, Mayor Lewis restated her motion to revisit the design of Fire Station #1, add resources at a separate temporary location for the interim, and immediately begin the work necessary to expand Fire Station #2. The additional firefighters, equipment, and engine as the 'interim solution' is estimated at \$1.3M and Fire Station #2 construction cost has been presented at \$6.7M for a total of \$8.0M. The funding would be from our current unencumbered funds. Council Member Salgado seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 6 ayes and 1 absent [Chambers].
